Various Areas of the AHQ and Addenda: Race/Ethnicity of Patients: The determination of a patient's race is based on the discretion of the admissions clerk. If the admissions clerk is unsure of the patient's race, the clerk must choose "Multi-racial/Unknown". As such, the figures provided should be considered only a rough approximation of true utilization by race at Northside Hospital. Northside also has 2 cystoscopy rooms at the hospital and 1 at Meridian Mark that are located outside of the sterile corridor. These rooms have open drains and do not meet the air handling requirements of a general operating room, so invasive surgical procedures requiring entry into a body cavity cannot be performed in these rooms.

Perinatal Addendum, Part A: As we have done on past surveys, we have reported the number of C-section rooms under "Number of Delivery Rooms".

Perinatal Addendum, Part C3: Northside does not assign CPT codes to inpatients. This average charge represents those patients classified under MS-DRG 775.
