Comments:

As stated in the past three years, the following continues to apply to reporting as requested by the ASC Survey. As a general rule, surgery centers do not keep separate data for OR patients versus Procedure Room patients. The breakout of this data for the survey is at best very difficult, if not impossible, to report accurately for every surgery center in the state. Patients are reported as being the same as procedures since it is not possible for HCA facilities to track data using the DHP definition distinguishing patients and procedures. Patients and procedures are reported in the same way for all HCA facilities, since all use the same data reporting system.
